Thank you for choosing our park for your visit. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the park policies so that all who visit the park may have a safe and enjoyable experience.

Safety:

1. The speed limit in the park at all times is 5 mph and it is strictly enforced.
2. Please help us keep the park safe by not bringing firearms or weapons of any kind into the park.
3. Hunting, spearfishing, and trotlines are not allowed. If you are a hunter or a law enforcement agent, see the office for a weapons permission tag.
4. Motorcycles or ATVs may be unloaded at the pavilion and driven out the entrance road only. They may not be driven into the park.
5. River entry is at your own risk. No lifeguards are on duty at any time. Park officials will remove rope swings hung on park property.
6. Glass containers must stay inside cabins and are not allowed in campsite areas. At no time should glass containers be in the public areas or swimming areas.
7. Pets are welcome in the park as long as they are on a leash at all times and are not a nuisance to other visitors. Those visitors who bring an aggressive dog breed such as a Rotweiler, Doberman, pit bull, or Ridgeback into the park may be asked to leave.
8. Unfortunately, no power tools or ladders are available for loan to campers. Park personnel will be happy to assist campers in the event these items are needed. A nominal fee may apply.
9. Tree limbs can break and fall. It is important that campers and visitors inspect their area and report any suspect trees or limbs to the park office so they can be taken care of. It is equally important that tents, cars, and other camping gear such as chairs not be left under any suspect trees or limbs.

Maintaining / Conserving Chalk Bluff Park:

10. Campers may bring their own firewood. However, OAK wood is not allowed in the park because the disease, oak wilt, can be brought into the park from outside wood and could devastate park trees.
11. Please help keep our park beautiful by not cutting or defacing any trees and/or branches in the park. Even if you believe a tree or branch is dead, please do not remove it.
12. Because of limited parking space available around cabins and camp sites, a maximum of 2 vehicles may be parked per cabin/site. If you visit someone else's cabin or campsite and there are two vehicles parked, please obtain a pavilion parking permit from the park office. Park officials recognize that this may be an inconvenience for some but feel it is necessary to maintain grounds and to respect neighboring campers.

Courtesy towards other campers:

13. Music levels should be controlled at all times, including while driving or in the boat dock or pecan grove areas. It is incorrect to assume that camping neighbors won't mind loud music. Inconsiderate visitors may be asked to leave the park.
14. Quiet hours start at 11:00 p.m. Neighboring campers should not be able to hear noise, music, or conversation at that point. Bright lights should be lowered or extinguished when quiet hours begin.
15. Generators are only allowed in the RV court.
16. Campers with reservations expect their cabin and/or camp site to have a picnic table and a barbecue pit/grate. Please do not remove these from a camp site, whether the site is empty or not. Also, trash cans and/or liners have been placed throughout the park for everyone's use. Please do not move these as well. If your needs are not being met regarding these items, let someone in the park office know and steps will be taken to accommodate reasonable requests.
17. Please keep driving to a minimum and resist "cruising" around the park. All drivers in the park must have a valid state driver's license.
18. Chalk Bluff is a family park. Public drunkenness, lewdness, profanity or any other inappropriate behavior will lead to violators being escorted from the park.

Other information:

19. A word of caution: resist driving on the river bed. Not only is it a violation of state law, you may get stuck and have to pay a minimum 50.00 towing fee.
20. Day visitors MUST depart by 8:00 p.m. in peak season and by dark in the off season. Anyone in the park past departure time will pay the overnight rate.
21. Office & store hours are posted and will vary. The store generally closes at 6 pm on week days.
22. Check out time is 1:00 p.m. To stay in the park until dark on your departure date, you must update your car pass with the office. An additional charge may apply.
23. A \$25.00 returned check fee will be assessed on any returned check. If necessary, legal action will be undertaken for collection purposes and any legal fees incurred will be the responsibility of the defendant.
24. Park officials reserve the right to inspect any cabin prior to checkout for damage and assess an additional cleaning fee if a cabin or campsite is deemed dirty beyond acceptable use limits.
25. If you leave the park, voluntarily or at the request of park officials, fees will not be refunded.

These policies may be amended as situations present themselves or as deemed necessary by park officials.
